# WHAT IS FILMAKADEMIE?

Filmakademie Baden-Wuerttemberg (FABW), with its more than 500 students and its international, hands-on approach to filmmaking, is one of the leading film and media schools in Europe.

FABW's departments resemble the actual workflow in the film industry, instructors are mostly industry professionals with a teaching mandate. In this setting, students are working in their respective departments, jointly producing no less than 300 films per year. These productions are internationally recognized more often than not, winning prizes at international festivals and awards -7 student Oscars among them.

With the Academy for Performing Arts (ADK), the Atelier Ludwigsburg-Paris (ALP) and the Animation Institute on campus, students find multiple opportunities to forge their individual networks according to their talents and interests, while honing the arts, crafts and economics of successful international careers in the audiovisual arts.

### ICLA is...

- a four-month, multidisciplinary workshop for 24 young filmmakers from all departments of FABW's international partner institutions
- held entirely in English
- a modular curriculum for two target groups: writers/directors/producers with the intent to develop future projects, and students of the departments image/sound/ editing/set design, etc.
- offering writers/directors/producers a think tank for script development across formats and genres for international projects
- offering students of image/sound/editing/ set design (etc.) hands-on training in practical workshops within an international group.

- Including all its participants in joint workshops, lectures and excursions
- Running from April till July of each year, with an option to stay until end-August
- Offering more than 300 hrs of classes

- have completed their BAs, or have at least two years of intensive training in film and media.
- presently be enrolled in one of FABW's partner institutions. Ask your home institution for details of the process.
- look for training opportunities in a multidisciplinary setting – be prepared to learn about working in film beyond your core department
- be able to hand in some of their previous works
- be open-minded, cosmopolitan personalities, ready to deal with people with different world views and cultural backgrounds.
- Be prepared to become part of a unique group of talented individuals from more than ten countries

# Multidisciplinary curriculum for advanced students

ICLA participants come from different departments. Consequently, there will be both mandatory and compulsory elements which will enable students to customize their experience, while interaction and networking within the whole group will generally have high priority.

At FABW, all classes are organized as blocks, so the schedule will greatly vary from week to week. In general, incoming students should expect four to five days of tutoring per week, each day starting around 10:00 a.m., ending around 05:30 p.m. A certificate will be presented in the last week, including a detailed transcript of academic performance.
